## JMG College Success

### Summary of outcomes for first two cohorts of students

The combined Fall 15 and Fall 16 total students =  
311

Comparative data benchmark against National Clearinghouse Education Services:

College Success program First to Second Year Overall Retention Rate = 79%

*Campus-Based NCES First to Second Year Retention Rate* = 61%

College Success Retention Rate Both Cohorts (311) at end of two years = 61%

College Success Persistence Rate Both Cohorts (311) at end of two years = 68%

**College Success Positive Outcome Rate Both Cohorts at end of two years = 87%**

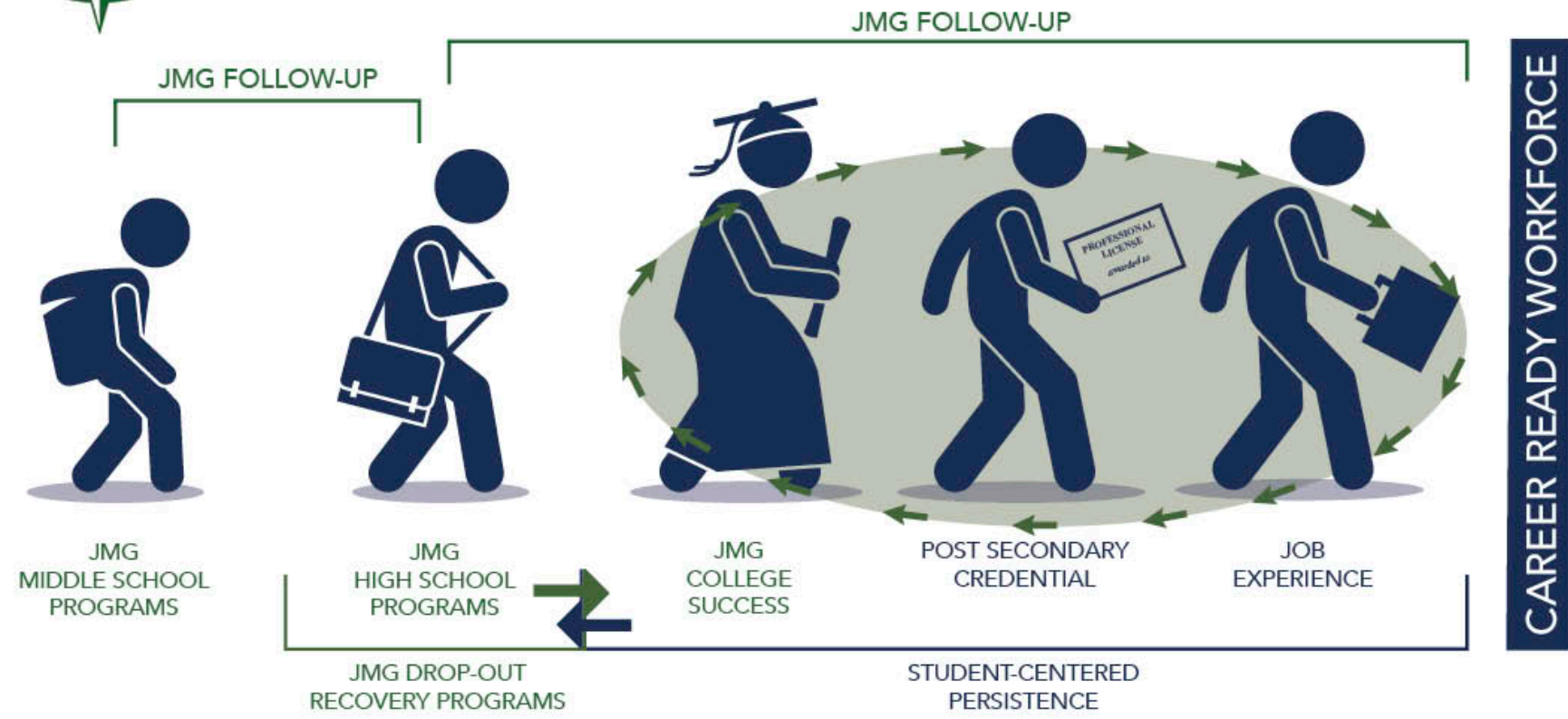

In 2017 only 42% of Mainers hold education and workforce credentials that position Maine and its families for success.

Goal for 2025: To meet the demands of the economy, 60% of the workforce will need a credential of value in addition to a high school diploma.

This translates to an increase of 158,000 skilled workers over today's numbers.
